Future demand for early years childcare places and out of school childcare places will in all probability be met by existing provision and forthcoming new provision over the five years - moving toward 2027.



Table 5 indicates that 23 fewer childcare places may be required by 2027:

- 14 fewer early years childcare places for 0-4 years would be required to maintain the 2022 sufficiency ratio.
- 9 fewer out of school childcare places for (including actual school-based) 5-11 year olds would be required to maintain the 2022 sufficiency ratio.

It can be noted in Table 6 below that, as part of the response to the summer 2022 CSA structured interviews with childcare providers, a number of early years childcare providers/settings and childminders that are located in the Crewe South Schools Planning Area stated an intention to develop new provision in the forthcoming two years - which was

34 new places.



Sustainability

33% of early years childcare providers/settings situated in the Crewe South Schools Planning Area stated that they were experiencing **ongoing** sustainability issues as a result of COVID-19 – and repeated themes were:

- 1. Recruitment of staff creating sustainability challenges
- 2. Income still being below optimum

0 out of school childcare providers situated in the Crewe South Schools Planning Area stated that they were experiencing ongoing sustainability issues as a result of COVID-19.

...and 50% of registered childminders situated in the Crewe South Schools Planning Area stated that they were experiencing ongoing sustainability issues as a result of COVID-19 – and repeated themes were:

- 1. Income still being below optimum
- 2. ...Some parents still working from home

Image C - how parents/families were continuing to feel in terms of their child(ren) (re)attending childcare, according to Crewe South Schools Planning Area-based childcare providers





Image D - length of time childcare providers stated that they expected to be providing childcare for







90% of Crewe South Schools Planning Area-based early years childcare settings/providers and out of school childcare providers stated that they were still noticing some ongoing effects of COVID-19 on the development, behavior or demeanor of certain children.

Correspondingly, 42% of Crewe South Schools Planning Area-based registered childminders stated that they were still noticing some ongoing effects of COVID-19 on the development, behavior or demeanor of certain children.

Ultimately, all setting-based (early years and out of school) childcare providers were requested to state, on a scale of 1 - 10, how **confident** they thought they were as a (whole) setting in supporting children/young people with SEND:

The average rating provided by early years childcare providers/setting was 8.4/10 – and thus it can be assumed that approximately 84% of early years providers are accessible to children with SEND in the Crewe South Schools Planning Area.

The average rating provided by out of school childcare providers/setting was 10/10 – and thus it can be assumed that all out of school providers are accessible to children with SEND in the Crewe South Schools Planning Area.

Additionally, the average rating provided by registered childminders was 7.2/10 – and thus it can be assumed that approximately 72% of childminders are accessible to children with SEND in the Crewe South Schools Planning Area.

Role of Cheshire East Council

Finally, all childcare providers were invited to state the types of further and continued support that they would appreciate from the local authority. The three most frequent requests were:

- 1. Support with sourcing training which is now (like pre-COVID) face-to-face
- 2. Networking themed support for childminders to help address feelings of isolation
- 3. Support with meeting the needs of SEND children

Perspective of Parents and Carers resident in the Crewe South Schools Planning Area

Background of respondents

5% of the respondents to the summer 2022 Cheshire East Council Childcare Parental Demand survey were resident in the Crewe South Schools Planning Area.

All responding parents and carers across all of the Schools Planning Areas were invited to state what term best described their current circumstances aligned to their **employment status**. The most frequent stated circumstance of responding parents was in full-time employment/self-employment (30 hours + per week) (40%), followed in frequency by part-time employment/self-employment (less than 30 hours per week) (33%).

All responding parents and carers responding from the Crewe South Schools Planning Area were invited to state their annual family income bracket (before tax).

Feedback from carers of children and young people with SEND

33% of responding parents, i.e. carers, who were resident in the Crewe South Schools Planning Area stated that they were caring for/raising at least one child with SEND or a long-term illness. The most frequent SEND type stated was Speech, Language and Communication Needs.

These relevant respondents were invited to describe any particular issue(s) they have experienced as a carer of a child with SEND in accessing childcare – and the most frequent was: Staff are not appropriately trained/qualified to support children with SEND.

The three most frequent themes and assurances that such relevant parents/carers stated that they would look for if they were to consider accessing formal childcare at some point in the future were – in order of frequency:

- 1. Good quality childcare
- 2. Affordable childcare
- 3. For it to be close to mt home

Funded Childcare

22% of responding Crewe South Schools Planning Area-resident, parents/carers stated that they had a child aged 2 years. However, 0 of such parents/carers subsequently stated that they were currently accessing the free entitlement for 2 year olds.

Additionally, 45% of responding parents/carers stated that they had a child aged 3 and/or 4 years and 75% of such parents/carers subsequently stated that they were currently accessing the universal 15 hours free entitlement for 3 and 4 year olds.

25% of such parents/carers subsequently stated that they were currently accessing the extended 30 hours childcare offer, with all of these parents/carers stating that it was either very easy to organise or fairly straightforward to organise.

Relevant parents were invited to give further feedback about funded childcare, with the most frequent type of feedback being (words to the effect) "ideally all parents with 2 year olds would receive such an entitlement".

Childcare and COVID-19

All Crewe South Schools Planning Area-resident parents of pre-school aged children were invited to state whether they had any concerns about their relevant child(ren)'s early development, including their early years education, as a direct result of the COVID-19 pandemic?

35% of relevant parents stated Yes and their specific feedback included:


"My daughter seems to be catching up now, but I was concerned early on in the pandemic that she was not seeing other children or socialising as she otherwise would have. We actually started her at nursery earlier than we had planned to just so that she would be around other children".

"He struggles to socialise and communicate now and also has no danger awareness".
