## **Wilmslow South**

Future demand for early years childcare places and out of school childcare places will in all probability be met by existing provision over the five years - moving toward 2027. However this sufficiency situation will require monitoring.

Existing providers may need to prepare for a small increase in demand.



Table 5 indicates that 13 new childcare places may be required by 2027:

- 7 new early years childcare places for 0-4 years would be required to maintain the 2022 sufficiency ratio.
- 6 new out of school childcare places for 5-11 year olds would be required to maintain the 2022 sufficiency ratio.

However, it can be noted in Table 6 below that, as part of the response to the summer 2022 CSA structured interviews with childcare providers, 7% of early years childcare providers/ settings that are located in the Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area stated an intention to develop new provision in the forthcoming two years - which was a total of 7 new places.



64% of early years childcare providers/settings situated in the Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area stated that they were experiencing *ongoing* sustainability issues as a result of COVID-19 – and repeated themes were:


- 1. Recruitment of staff creating sustainability challenges

0 of out of school childcare providers situated in the Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area stated that they were experiencing ongoing sustainability issues as a result of COVID-19.



<u>Image D - length of time childcare providers stated that they expected to be providing childcare for</u>





61% of setting-based early years childcare and out of school childcare providers stated that they had at least one team member with a SEND-themed qualification.


Repeated examples of qualifications stated were:

61% of Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area-based early years childcare settings/providers and out of school childcare providers stated that they were still noticing some ongoing effects of COVID-19 on the development, behavior or demeanor of certain children.

Correspondingly, 33% of Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area-based registered childminders stated that they were still noticing some ongoing effects of COVID-19 on the development, behavior or demeanor of certain children.

Ultimately, all setting-based (early years and out of school) childcare providers were requested to state, on a scale of 1 - 10, how **confident** they thought they were as a (whole) setting in supporting children/young people with SEND:

The average rating provided by early years childcare providers/setting was 8.6/10 – and thus it can be assumed that approximately 86% of early years providers are accessible to children with SEND in the Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area.

The average rating provided by out of school childcare providers/setting was 5.3/10 – and thus it can be assumed that approximately 53% of out of school providers are accessible to children with SEND in the Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area.

Additionally, the average rating provided by registered childminders was 7/10 – and thus it can be assumed that approximately 70% of childminders are accessible to children with SEND in the Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area.

#### Role of Cheshire East Council

Finally, all childcare providers were invited to state the types of further and continued support that they would appreciate from the local authority. The two repeated requests were:

- 1. Advice on recruitment and retention
- 2. Advice on finance and budgets

# Perspective of Parents and Carers resident in the Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area

#### Background of respondents

6% of the respondents to the summer 2022 Cheshire East Council Childcare Parental Demand survey were resident in the Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area.

All responding parents and carers across all of the Schools Planning Areas were invited to state what term best described their current circumstances aligned to their **employment status**. The most frequent stated circumstance of responding parents was in full-time employment/self-employment (30 hours + per week) (35%), followed in frequency by part-time employment/self-employment (less than 30 hours per week) (21.5%).

All responding parents and carers responding from the Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area were invited to state their annual family income bracket (before tax).

## Feedback from carers of children and young people with SEND

5% of responding parents, i.e. carers, who were resident in the Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area stated that they were caring for/raising at least one child with SEND or a long-term illness.

The most frequent SEND type stated was Autistic Spectrum Condition.

- 6% of responding parents from the Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area stated that they were: **accessing informal childcare only**
- 68% of responding parents from the Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area stated that they were: **accessing formal and informal childcare**

The two most frequent themes and assurances that such relevant parents/carers stated that they would look for if they were to consider accessing formal childcare at some point in the future were – in order of frequency:

- 1. For it to be close to my home/work
- 2. For it to be affordable
- 3. Good quality

#### **Funded Childcare**

22% of responding Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area-resident, parents/carers stated that they had a child aged 2 years. (Only) 12.5% of such parents/carers subsequently stated that they were currently accessing the free entitlement for 2 year olds.

Additionally, 72% of responding parents/carers stated that they had a child aged 3 and/or 4 years and 15% of such parents/carers subsequently stated that they were currently accessing the universal 15 hours free entitlement for 3 and 4 year olds.

15% of such parents/carers also subsequently stated that they were currently accessing the extended 30 hours childcare offer, with all of these parents/carers stating that it was either very easy to organise or fairly straightforward to organise – with just one exception, a parent that stated: it was not as easy as I would have liked.

One parent made the following observation about the 30 hours childcare offer:

"As he attends multiple settings, I have to complete the form twice per term which is a repetitive and they never send through at exactly the same time. An easier option would be being able to do one form across both settings and/or having a form like this where you can click to say that nothing has changed etc."

#### Childcare and COVID-19

All Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area-resident parents of pre-school aged children were invited to state whether they had any concerns about their relevant child(ren)'s early development, including their early years education, as a direct result of the COVID-19 pandemic?


(Only) 3% of relevant parents stated Yes, with one such response being qualified:

"My son struggled post COVID-19 to make friends and interact with other children... and still isn't quite there compared to his friends. I feel this is a direct result from COVID-19".

#### Barriers to accessing childcare

All Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area-resident parents were invited to state whether – at some point in time – they had experienced specific barriers to accessing childcare:

#### Childcare and Cheshire East Council

All Wilmslow South Schools Planning Area-resident parents were invited to state whether there was anything that Cheshire East Council should be doing in terms of supporting parents and carers with childcare, in 2022. Their responses tended to focus on the theme of accessibility:

Some places closed in 2020 and there was not [in my experience] enough places just after the lockdowns

Shorter waiting lists, greater availability of formal preschool nursery places and more affordability is needed in this county - though I don't really see how these issues fall reasonably within Cheshire East Council's control

Enabling more after school club places for younger primary age children could be a focus...

Finally, all parents were invited to state whether they were aware of the existence of Cheshire East Family Information Service. For those who responded to this question: 11% stated that they were – and 89% stated that they were not, or did not provide a specific response either way.
